OPENING PRAYER

In the Name of the Father and of the Son † and of the Holy Spirit Amen...

† (Make the sign of the cross)

Heavenly Father, I come before You having of course sinned again, acknowledging that I am a sinner. I do not want to be this way, yet I find myself falling into sin. As Paul confessed, 'For I do not do the good I want to do, but the evil I do not want to do—this I keep on doing. CONFESSION
